# Around The Communities General

- The Parish was very grateful for the support received from the Community Support Officer, PC Anthony Labram, on policing matters during the year.
- The Parish is also very grateful for the support that it has received from the Highways department during the year in maintaining the roads within the Parish.
- Numerous potholes and drainage issues have been reported, across the Parish.
- A number of Foot Path signs have been replaced in the Parish.
- The Parish Council is indebted to Geoff Anderson for his support in maintaining the Council's website during the year.
- The move towards the Westmorland and Furness Unitary Authority has progressed smoothly.

# In Kirkland and Blencarn

- The Dalefoot Compost Enterprise, based at Blencarn Hall Farm, was subject to a Planning Enforcement Enquiry. The outcome confirming that no planning permission was required.
- A Commemorative Tree to the late Queen Elizabeth II was planted on Kirkland Village Green.

- A steep track on Blencarn Village Green was repaired.
- During 2022/2023 the Council considered 3 planning applications in Kirkland and Blencarn.

# In Culgaith

- New Road Signs at the entrances to Culgaith have been installed, along with the repositioning of a 30mph sign on Station Road and the introduction of new 40mph speed limits on the entrances to the village.
- Acorn Bank 10k Run was agreed and welcomed.
- The use of HGV's, over 7.5 tonnes and coaches, using the 'The Pea', in Culgaith, was raised with WAFC Highways and the Police.
- Worn Road Junction markings in Culgaith were repainted.
- Culgaith School Yellow 'No Parking' Road Markings were repainted.
- Two Coronation Benches, in conjunction with the Vic Café, were installed by the Culgaith War Memorial.
- 'The Pea' to Station Road flooding issues were reported.
- A Jubilee Oak was planted in Culgaith to Commemorate the late Queen Elizabeth II
- During 2022/2023 the Council considered 2 planning applications in Culgaith

# In Skirwith

- Footway lighting issues were addressed.
- Skirwith to Kirkland roadside boundary fence; to be repaired when funding is available.
- A 'Green Waste' skip was provided, as in previous years, in Skirwith.
- Skirwith Bus Shelter An external mural was approved.
- Major Electricity safety tree pruning was agreed to, with Electricity NW in Church Street.
- Beck Cottage Essential Tree Maintenance
  was agreed
- During 2022/2023 the Council considered 4 planning applications in Skirwith.
