## **RULES**

Please read all the rules carefully, in fairness to all they shall be strictly enforced.

1. Exhibitors are limited to residents of Culgaith, people who work in the village and all children attending Culgaith School. All entries with entry fees must be in by September 1st. All entries cost 25p each. Children's entries are FREE.
  2. Entries are limited to 3 per person per class.
  3. The 2011 theme for the Floral Displays section is Royal Wedding
  4. Exhibits in the Handicraft Section MUST NOT have been previously shown at the Show.
  5. Photographs in the Photography Section must have been taken by you. Exhibits MUST NOT be mounted or have been previously shown in our Show. Photographs must not exceed 7"x 5" (18 cm x 13 cm) in size and must have exhibitor's numbers on the BACK
  6. All entries in the Children's section must have been made or grown exclusively by the exhibitor.
  7. All entries to be in the village hall by 10.30 am on the morning of the show, after which no exhibit will be accepted.
  8. The show will open at 2 p.m. and close at 4.30 p.m. before which time nothing shall be removed.
  9. All exhibits must clearly show the exhibitor's number and all exhibits not wearing a number will be eliminated.
  10. Prize money for Adults is 1<sup>st</sup> 75p, 2<sup>nd</sup> 50p, 3<sup>rd</sup> 25p.
  11. Prize money for under 13s is 1<sup>st</sup> £3, 2<sup>nd</sup> £2, 3<sup>rd</sup> £1.
  12. All entries exhibited for prize money must really and truly be his or her property. Anyone attempting to gain prizes by deception shall forfeit all claims to such prize money.
  13. **ALL PRIZE MONEY** will be paid out during the week after the show by the Committee.
